This means patients get back to the lives they love that much sooner.


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Why Choose Saint Luke's

We give patients a second chance at life

All referred patients undergo medical and psychological evaluation to determine whether they're transplant candidates. We work with patients, their families, and the referring nephrologist to help them prepare physically, emotionally, and spiritually.

How it works

Kidney transplant candidates are given a thorough physical and psychological evaluation by our transplant team. We educate patients and their families about transplantation to help them determine whether it's their best treatment choice. While waiting for transplant, we send regular progress updates to the dialysis center and referring nephrologist.

After transplantation, patients will remain at Saint Luke's Hospital of Kansas City for four to seven days. In the months following discharge, they receive follow-up care at one of our post-kidney transplant clinics.

Once the patient is stable, we provide ongoing monitoring and shared care with the referring nephrologist.

Living donors

Patients who receive organs from living donors tend to have better outcomes than patients who receive organs from deceased donors. That's why we encourage patients to consider asking family members or friends to donate a kidney.

Any healthy person is eligible to donate a kidney. Donors and recipients do not need to be the same blood type or even related. Visit saintlukeskc.org/kidney-transplant to learn more about this option.
